

## Overview

A career-focused course with access to state-of-the-art equipment. Helps students gain a strong understanding of the design process and develop an impressive portfolio of work.

Industry-based project requirements help build relationships with employers - and successful completion provides a route on to University or to study a specific area of 3D Design.

## What you'll learn

The course is made up of 8 modules. The first year covers:

- Foundation Skills for 3D Design
- Contextual Studies for 3D Design
- Design Methods & Principles
- Materials, Processes & Manufacturing

And in the second year you'll study:

- Professional Development
- Contemporary Studies in 3D Design
- Professional Engagement & Employability Skills
- Final Major Project

## Assessments / Exams

Although grading is on coursework, there'll be regular assessments by tutors. Tutorials will take place throughout the year. Students are also encouraged to submit their work to national student design competitions such as the Royal Society of Arts (RSA) Awards.

## A typical week

There are chances to go abroad each year to destinations like Barcelona, Berlin and New York!

## Entry requirements

You'll ideally need 120 UCAS points (a BTEC Extended Diploma pass or 2 A-Levels at grade D or above), but if you haven't got these you can still apply if you have a strong portfolio of work. Ideally you'll also have GCSE English and Maths at grade C or above. At interview you'll need to show your portfolio.

## Our teaching staff

Programme Leader Mathew Brown studied Product Design at Ravensbourne, before completing his MA at Kingston University. He's worked as an educator and practitioner since the late 90s, including as a senior lecturer at UCA, and at UEL (where he still also works). Mathew has also designed and manufactured his own range of interior accessory products, supplying them to The Conran Shop and John Lewis. He continues to develop his own professional work and research opportunities.

## Links with employers

There are chances to work for external clients on 'live' briefs throughout the course.

In year 2 a 'professional engagement' work-based project is a requirement. This can lead to a paid internship or even a full-time job after the course...
